ELK OF THE YEAR 2023-2024 - DOUG SHEARER



DOUG SHEARER

grew up in the small farming town of Genoa Illinois. In his Senior year in High School, he figured there had to be something better in life than

stacking hay in a hay mow in 100 degree heat, so he enlisted in the Air Force as a Heavy Equipment Operator. After two years at Spangdahlem AFB, Germany, he received orders to Vandenberg AFB joining the "Fire Dozer Team" cutting firebreaks and working on the Space Shuttle Complex operating a 55 ton Mobile Crane. He installed a static display Missile at the Main Gate.

In 1984 he transferred to the Air Force Reserve and was hired by the City of Santa Maria as a Landfill Heavy Equipment Operator. In 1988 his Landfill Supervisor, Albert Montes asked him to join the Lodge and be part of the Elks BBQ Teams because they needed someone young to help flip chicken screens and pull rods of meat. In early 2000, after years of being mentored by very "Seasoned" BBQ Captains, he started his own BBQ team. To this day, Doug proudly admits that any recognition, awards, including "Elk of the Year" would not have been possible without his BBQ Teammates...PERIOD!!!

In 2010, Wayne Stahl (2017-2018 Elk of the Year) asked Doug and Johnny Silva to take over the BBQ Committee which assigns BBQ Teams for Lodge events.

All American Lodge

During the Covid shutdown, Doug teamed up with the Lodge Manager, Lodge Officers, and Kitchen Manager Francis Brawner, (2022-2023 Elk of the Year) to put together "To Go" meals as a way to keep a positive revenue stream coming into the Lodge. Doug took on the job of making the plaques in the BBQ room and, during the shutdown, Doug fabricated and welded five new sets of chicken screens for the BBQ room and a cart to transport them, then he built four new heavy-duty carts to transport cases of chicken and meat from the kitchen to the BBQ room.

A Herculean project that Johnny Silva and Doug took on in 2021, was the removal of 12 Pine Tree's at the front entrance of the Lodge. With a dedicated team of volunteers and some very generous local vendors, the estimated two week project was completed in one weekend.

Doug retired from the Air Force in 2008 at the Rank of Chief Master Sergeant and from the City of Santa Maria in 2017 where he finished his career as the Landfill Supervisor. He also retired from his commitments to the BBQ Committee in 2022 after 34 years of loyal service to the Lodge. He still stays busy, maintaining their family place in the country with his wife Tracy, and grading/maintaining roads for local ranchers.

Elks Lodge 1538 is a flagship among Elk Lodges and not just another "Bar or Club." As such we have a Dress Code. Most times it is casual and allows more casual wear: Long shorts, like Bermuda and cargo style shorts are acceptable after 6:00 pm except Thursday Lodge Night.

- · Please no mid-thigh, cutoffs, short-shorts, or torn/frayed wear.
- · Please wear all pants at your waist, not below! And no "Plumber Pants!"
- · No Sweat Suits or Beach Apparel No Flip Flops (rubber style shower shoes) Sandals okay
- · FOR LADIES: No Inappropriate tops No dresses shorter than mid thigh
- FOR MEN: Collared shirts required after 6:00 pm on Thursday and Friday. No muscle shirts No T-shirts or caps with vulgar or inappropriate slogans No gang attire. Gentleman, wear pants at the waist, not below! Hats should be worn properly, not backwards or sideways, and please remove hats when sitting at the table to eat.

Our Greeters, Staff, and Officers do not wish to embarrass or upset any Member or guest, so please do not put them in that position. We will ask you to leave to change. Members, remind your guests that you are responsible for them!

Members,

There are many traditions in the Lodge and in Elkdom that have survived for over a hundred years and many that have been done away with. When we make new

traditions in the Lodge, we are adding to its unique and wonderful history. Here are a few interesting tidbits of history.

Becoming a Member used to be much livelier than just attending initiation. For example, early candidates required a physician's certificate of examination as a part of the joining process, and the male prospect had to be in top condition to even be considered. Then, once the candidate had met those criteria and was in the Lodge room, where he was blindfolded--instead of just having the lights dimmed and hearing the beautiful words of Initiation—and he was subjected to much horseplay and shenanigans.

A few of these shenanigans, all of which were contained in the Ritual Book, described candidates wearing shoes with lead soles designed to make the wearer walk as though intoxicated; additionally, they were forced to "walk on broken glass," actually egg shells, be "shaved" simulated by a dull file scraped on the face by the city barber, and it even at times ending the "horseplay" session with real guns, loaded with blanks, being fired behind the now weary and very confused new Members.

In 1895, the Elks ceased the use of lambskin aprons in their initiatory work, the password was eliminated in 1899, in 1902 the use of a badge was eliminated, with the secret grip falling by the wayside in 1904, and the "Test Oath" was removed in 1911. In 1952, candidates were no longer blindfolded prior to the Initiation, and in 1995, women were admitted into the Order.

While we no longer subject our candidates to such extremes, there are many beautiful and wonderful traditions that I am proud and honored to uphold within the Lodge. Let us all never forget our great history and continue to make the Elks the greatest fraternal organization in the world.

FROM THE SECRETARY'S DESK

REINSTATEMENTS

There are two options to being reinstated as a Member:

1. If you were just dropped in March 2023 for non-payment there are two options:

a. There is a 2-month window until May 29, 2023, in which you can reinstate without a fee and or a sponsor and or vote on the floor; however, you must pay last year's dues of \$149 and this year's dues of \$154 and you will be reinstated immediately.

b. In June 2023 only: you can reinstate for only \$1 (instead of the \$75 fee) plus the prorated dues of this year. This option will require a sponsor and two

references as normal and a vote on the floor of the Lodge.

- 2. If you were a Member in the past and would like to reinstate here are your options:
 - a. In June 2023 only: you can reinstate for only \$1 (instead of the \$75 fee) plus the prorated dues of this year. This option still requires a sponsor and two references as normal and a vote on the floor of the Lodge.
 - b. Any other month of the year the reinstatement fee is \$75 plus the prorated dues, and you still need a sponsor and a vote on the floor of the Lodge.

We will have information booths and different local agencies to help veterans with questions regarding housing and mental and health issues. We will also serve a delicious lunch and provide free personal hygiene products and clothing essentials.

The Mini Stand Downs for 2022 and 2023 were made possible by an Impact Grant from the Elks National Foundation (ENF). Impact Grants are offered to Lodges working to make a significant and meaningful difference in the community through a charitable project. These competitive grants of up to \$10,000 inspire Elks to dedicate themselves to service and volunteerism and are designed to set a standard of excellence in community leadership through service. The ENF awards Impact Grants to Lodges who intimately understand a problem in their community, have a unique idea about how to solve it, and who are ready with the volunteer power to get it done.

In 2022, the ENF budgeted \$500,000 to support 60 Lodges with 2022 Impact Grants. 46 of these Lodges were approved for Renewal Impact Grant funding, and 14 Lodges began new projects in 2022. We were part of the 14 with our new project "Veterans Mini Stand Down." If you visit the ENF's website under Impact Grants for 2022 this is what it said about us: "Santa Maria Lodge 1538 will host Veteran Stand Downs & Lunches to serve as a place for veterans to socialize, eat. receive supplies, and obtain information on services provided at the local, state and federal levels." We plan to apply for renewable Impact Grant funding and continue to serve our veterans and those who currently serve to protect our freedoms and keep us safe.
